5.4	Furnish details of the following aspects of curriculum design: Innovation such as modular curricula Inter/multidisciplinary approach	In today's rapidly changing world filled with complex challenges, it is essential to reform curriculum in a way so that students are better prepared to excel in technical knowledge as well as employability. At Brainware University, the curriculum for different programmes has been designed with modular approach where the syllabi of different courses are fragmented into independent modules. The curricula in the various departments are updated keeping in tune with regulatory bodies as PCI, AICTE, UGC, etc. of the respective programmes. CBCS has been implemented in the University for all UGC-approved programmes as per UGC guidelines. In fact, elective courses, as well as, various interdisciplinary courses are floated in all programmes throughout the University to make the curricula more flexible and allow the students to adapt to their individual needs. For example, the B. Tech. Curriculum has been enriched with cross-disciplinary courses like Entrepreneurship, Human Resource Development, Project Development etc. Following UGC regulations, Environmental Studies has been incorporated in the curriculum. Students are also trained in Human Values and Professional Ethics that

		offers guiding principles of our life and would enable a student to become a better individual. The University takes extra care to groom each and every student of the University with soft skill training, aptitude courses and so on. In fact, soft skill as well as aptitude courses have been included in the regular curriculum to create an industry ready professional. Thus, we, at Brainware University, go beyond merely applying textbook formulae to identify and create opportunities.

The 11 cases were discussed in the Examination Disciplinary Committee meeting. In 4 cases, students were trying to copy from the chit sheets and were caught inside the examination hall.</p> <p>These 4 students were made to appear before the Committee explaining their reasons for malpractice. They were asked to appear before the Committee along with their parents/guardians on 11th January, 2019. One candidate</p>

		reported with his guardian and the rest reported physically without their guardians. Further, the Committee, after due deliberation, decided to issue warning letters to their home address.
